Nez de jobourg



The "Nez de jobourg" is a rocky promontory (of gneiss) located at the extreme south of the "Cap de la Hague", on the commune of Jobourg .This is the oldest geological area in the Cotentin, dating from the Precambrian (2 billion years). The "Nez de Jobourg" (from the Scandinavian word "ness", meaning "cape") is admired for its views, the high cliffs rising upto 128 meters, its caves, and the fauna found there while walking along the coastal path called "Le chemin des douaniers ".It allows you to see from the "Pointe de Goury" and its lighthouse, as far as the "Cap de Fermanville", and off at sea , the Channel Islands .Off at sea as well, the "Raz Blanchard "has separated "La Hague", Alderney and Jersey for between 5000 and 7000 years .
